How to Have Reconciliation Among People in Prayer Groups Part 3 of 3

“If you bring your gift to the altar and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift at the altar, go first to be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift” (Matt 5:23-24). “This is how all will know you for my disciple; by your love for one another” (John 13:35).

There should be no competition among members in a prayer group. Neither should there be competition among prayer groups. Each person, each group has unique charisms. God did not set up each person or group to be clones. The function of each is according to the will of God. We should rejoice in our differences.

This is what fulfills the truth of the message and the diversity of God’s gifts.

I personally think it is a good thing for prayer groups within a close distance to come together occasionally and experience the giftedness of each group. It is in this way that we all can grow and experience what God is doing in other areas.

“To the elders among you, I a fellow elder, a witness of Christ’s sufferings and sharer in the glory that is to be revealed make this appeal, God’s flock is in your midst; give it a shepherd’s care. Watch over it willingly as God would have you do, not under constraint; and not for shameful profit either, but generously. Be examples to the flock, not lording it over those assigned to you, so that when the chief Shepherd appears you will win for yourselves the unfading

crown of glory” (1 Peter 5:1-4).

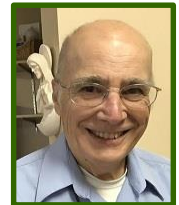
